| <p><u>Pennsylvania Patient Assistance Program Clearinghouse (PAP)</u></p> <p>Pharmaceutical manufacturers sponsor programs that provide certain prescription medications free of charge to people who meet specific income qualifications and do not otherwise have access to necessary medications. Not all manufacturers participate in the patient assistance programs; however, many do participate through the Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers’ Association (PhRMA). Only drugs manufactured by participating manufacturers are included in this program.</p> <p>In January 2001, PACE started working with APPRISE Coordinators and physicians to help eligible people find prescription assistance through PhRMA. If you are between 55 and 64 years of age or if you are disabled and do not receive any prescription coverage, we may be able to help you apply for prescription assistance through PhRMA.</p> <p>Each manufacturer has set their own eligibility guidelines, including income limits. On average, most manufacturers use the following income criteria:</p> <p>Single person \$20,000 or less Married person \$25,000 or less</p> | 1-800-955-0989 |

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| <p>Person with more than 2 dependents \$30,000 or less</p> <p>If you have or are eligible for other prescription benefits, including state or federal prescription programs, you will not qualify for benefits through PhRMA.</p> <p>In addition to the patient assistance programs offered by PhRMA, the PA PAP Clearinghouse also aids individuals in applying for prescription benefits funded through settlements brought forward by the Pennsylvania Attorney General's Office. Examples include the Medco Program which offers \$600 of free generic medications and the LCAP Program which covers lorazepam and chlorazepate, medications used to treat anxiety disorders.</p> <p>If you believe you qualify for these programs based on the guidelines above, please call the Clearinghouse at 1-800-955-0989. While taking your application, the Clearinghouse staff will also provide you with information on various foundations or organizations that may be available to offer you additional health benefits.</p> | |
